Would you like to learn more about owning your own affordable home? Habitat for Humanity Yukon will begin Information Sessions in December for families that cannot afford a conventional mortgage and wish to work with us to own their own home. To be eligible, families must be in need of adequate shelter; must be able to pay an affordable mortgage (no interest, no down-payment) and be willing to partner with us (provide 500 hours of "sweat equity"). If you are interested or know of a family that would like to learn more about us, please come to one of our Information Sessions (December 16th and January 13th at the Public Library).
